You are talking about placements, which reflect your foresight in planning for financial independence and having a solid backup plan alongside your preparation. It's a smart and practical move in the current scenario. Having a career backup truly provides moral support during competitive exam preparation. I'm genuinely proud of myself for guiding such a smart and thoughtful aspirant.

Let me get straight to the point, my dear friend — begin your journey with these three steps –

1. Previous year question paper
2. Syllabus copy
3. Choose study materials that are easily accessible and align with the standards of your examination. (Online+ offline).

Most top rank holders began their preparation early, often during their college years. You have a total of two years in your plan — one year during your college studies, and the following year dedicated entirely to strengthening your preparation.

You may plan for both year separately for Group II TNPSC Exam.

1st year for building foundation.

2nd year for covering the syllabus along with mock test and multiple revision of your short notes.

What does the syllabus actually demand for the Group II exams? The syllabus and previous year questions (PYQs) will definitely guide you and set clear boundaries for your preparation.

Goal of the Foundation Stage: Develop strong conceptual clarity and cultivate consistent reading habits –

Booklist and Strategy:

- Study 6th–8th standard textbooks for History, Geography, Science, and Polity.
- Begin with Indian Polity (Laxmikanth), General Science (School books), and Indian History.
- Read daily current affairs (The Hindu, Monthly compilations).
- Practice Aptitude (R.S. Aggarwal) for an hour daily.
- End each week by summarizing key points in brief notes.

**Polity (Political Science):** Focus on 10th, 11th, and 12th-grade school books. For advanced study - M. Laxmikanth (English medium) or the Indian Constitution book by Pragatheesh Publications (Tamil medium)

**Indian National Movement (INM):** Emphasizes school books (8th, 10th, 12th) and solving previous year questions (PYQs). Additional resources include A Brief History of Modern India by Spectrum Publications (English) or History of Indian Freedom Struggle by Prof. Ka. Venkatesan (Tamil).

**History, Heritage, and Culture of Tamil Nadu) - This is highlighted as a high-scoring area.**

**Part A (Tamil Literature/Sangam Era):** School Tamil books (6th to 12th), plus Tamil Ilakkiya Thagaval Kalanjiyam by Dr. Devi.

**Part B (Tamil Nadu Development):** Focus on the Justice Party, Dravidian Movements, and Periyar, suggesting the book Periyar's 1000 Questions and Answers.

**Indian History:** Study school books (6th to 12th), including non-syllabus but essential topics like Buddhism and Jainism. Recommended external books are Ancient and Medieval India by Poonam Dalal Dahiya (English) or Ancient and Medieval Indian History by Prof. Ka. Venkatesan (Tamil).

**State Affairs Updates (Tamil Nadu):** Focus on government schemes and current developments. Cover social issues in India and Tamil Nadu, using newspapers and monthly magazines as sources.

**Social and Economic Problems in India and Tamil Nadu by Pasiva (Tamil).**

**Geography and Economics:** Stress on 10th, 11th, and 12th-grade school books. For these two subjects, external books are generally considered unnecessary, but one-liner guides can be used if finding the subjects difficult.

**Science:** Prioritizes 10th-grade Science (Physics, Chemistry, Biology) or focusing on 10-15 high-impact topics (exp - Acids, Electricity).

**Maths (Aptitude):** Essential for a full score of 25. Recommends practicing all sums from school books, the SCERT Maths book from Suresh, or the Kalakkanitham book from Choice Academy, along with PYQ.

**Current Affairs:** A crucial section for both Prelims and Mains. Key areas to focus on include: Awards, Sports (Special Games), Books/Authors, Indices/Reports (HDI, MDI), ISRO/Space, Important Conferences (G20, G7), Defense news, and Key Appointments.

**General Tamil:** Mandates reading the 6th to 12th-grade school books "cover-to-cover" and continuous revision of important topics like Kambaramayanam and Silappathikaram.

### Practice Model test :

Goal: Strengthen speed, retention, and accuracy.

- Revise all completed subjects once.
- Start solving TNPSC previous year question papers.
- Attempt two full mock tests per week (one subject-wise, one full-length).
- Focus on high-weightage areas: Indian Polity, Tamil Nadu History, and Mental Ability.
- Allocate extra time to weak areas and quick daily revisions.

Core Subject : Complete TNPSC Prelims syllabus once entirely Begin descriptive answer writing for Mains (essay, translation). Revise short notes twice monthly. Focus on Tamil Nadu-specific topics like Culture, Administration, and Economy. Continue mock tests every 3–4 days. Keep one This 12-month framework ensures month for intensive revision before prelims.

Move to advanced School books (9th–12th) for History, Geography, and Economy.

Start Environment and Science Technology basics. Cover current affairs for the past six months comprehensively. -Weekly mock test every Sunday with review. Begin optional focus language preparation (English or Tamil).

Spend 30–45 minutes daily on current affairs.

- Set monthly goals and assess progress against TNPSC syllabus.
- Consolidate key facts, dates, and one-liners for last-month revision.
- Watch online lectures if classroom time is limited.

Consistent improvement while managing college studies effectively. By the end of your final year, you'll have a strong foundation for both the Prelims and Mains, giving you flexibility to appear for TNPSC or pursue campus opportunities confidently.
